Erin Taylor

Erin is the current Behavioral Health Supervisor for Integrated Services Behavioral Health team in Washington County. She has been leading the team for four and half years, since they rolled out in Washington County in January of 2020. Erin completed her Master's Degree in Clinical and Mental Health Counseling in 2017 from Ohio University. She is currently dually, independently licensed in Ohio as a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor - with supervision designation - and a Licensed Independent Chemical Dependency Counselor. Erin is trained in trauma-focused CBT, Prolonged Exposure therapy and EMDR therapy for the treatment of trauma and PTSD in people of all ages. Erin states that she views this work from a trauma-informed perspective and believes that prenatal trauma, disrupted attachments in infancy, childhood trauma, generational trauma, cultural trauma, etc. are the building blocks for mental illness and substance use disorder.

“Not a single person is immune from trauma, loss, grief in this life and not a single person is immune from mental illness and substance use disorder. It is our obligation to align with one another to support one another on this journey - which is no easy feat. I am also a person in long-term recovery from PTSD and SUD, and view my work from the perspective of the client, always, as I am the client before I am the professional.”
